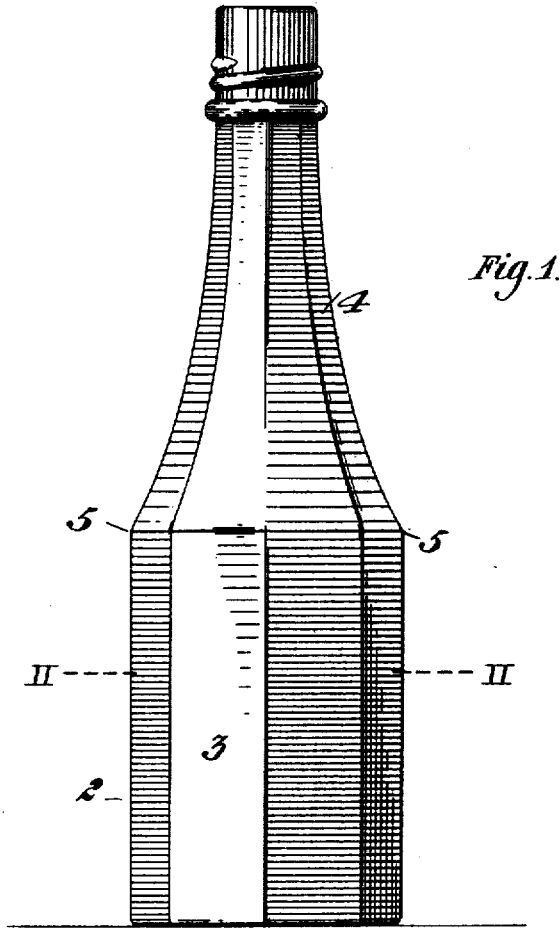

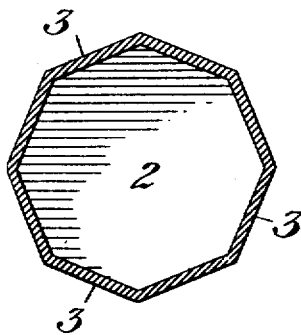

DESIGN FOR A BOTTLE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 22,312, dated March 28, 1893.

Application filed December 5, 1892. Serial No. 454,177. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY J. HEINZ, of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for Bottles, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which show—

In Figure 1 a side elevation of a bottle embodying my design, and in Fig. 2 a horizontal section on the line II—II of Fig. 1.

My design consists in a bottle, of form substantially as herein shown and described.

In the drawings, I show the bottle having a body portion 2 formed of polygonal shape in cross-section, with plain panels 3 extending about one-half of the height of the bottle.

The upper part 4 of the bottle is tapering, of frustum shape, and has a paneled surface polygonal in cross-section. There is a well-defined sharp angle between the tapering upper portion of the bottle and the straight lower portion or body thereof, the same forming a line 5 which encircles the body.

I claim—

The design for bottles substantially as herein shown and described.
